

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

"We noticed a big problem around our whole world. There is rubbish around our school, our town and everywhere! We collected data. We counted all of the rubbish around our school and then we made bar graphs. The 'least' amount of rubbish was in the middle school area (pink bar) and the 'most' amount of rubbish was in the 'Senior' area (green bar) of our school" (Issy Moir).
