Thanks everyone for your support with our school operating at Alert Level 2. There has been a smooth transition into this level and the children have taken to it like ducks to water!

The Ministries of Education and Health both stipulate that children should be attending school as usual in Level 2. If a child is unwell, they should remain at home. If after three days of continuous absence,a medical certificate will be required upon their return to school. If your child is tested for COVID-19, they must remain at home until the test results are reported back to you. In the event of a positive test, the Ministry of Health would contact the school immediately.

Rippa Rugby with Hannah


