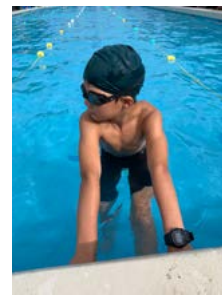

# Koru Kids at KKPS



ERO (Education Review Office) describes Whakawhānaungatanga as the process of establishing links, making connections and relating to the people one meets by identifying in culturally appropriate ways, whakapapa linkages, past heritages, points of engagement, or other relationships.

In term 1, our Inquiry focus is Whakawhānaungatanga, which is why next week our terrific teachers have planned activities that help to build relationships. Rōpu days provide an opportunity for children to meet others (teachers and children) in a supported environment. Tuakana/Teina relationships are encouraged and celebrated. Activities are inclusive and fun, and promote KORU values.

Rōpu days continue to provide opportunities for whānaungatanga throughout the year. They are an important part of life at KKPS, KORU school. Rōpu Days are held twice each term - generally in weeks 4 and 8 (though this is subject to change)

Next week, we have our first Rōpu Day on Thursday 25th March from 9.30am-12.30pm. We welcome whānau to come and join in with us. 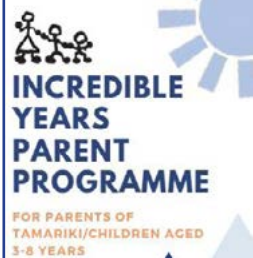
