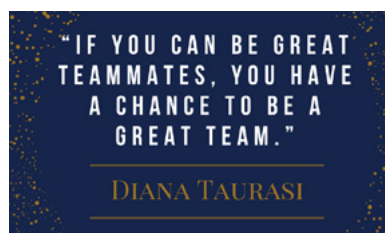

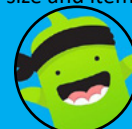

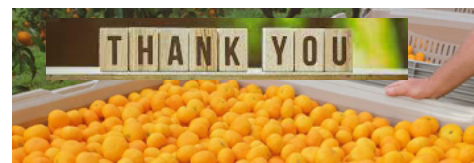

Week Three - Owning Our Learning

KKPS has 4 KORU values- 'Kia Kaha', 'Owning our Learning', 'Respect and Responsible' and 'Understanding and Accepting'. Over the coming newsletters we'll break down these values, what they mean and how our tamariki are on a journey to develop them. This week we shine a light on OWNING OUR LEARNING

Tāku Hikoi - Owning Our Learning

EMERGENT: I am curious about learning

BEGINNER: I am ready to learn. I ask questions. I explore the things around me to help me learn.

NOVICE: I use the things I already know to learn more. I ask questions to learn more. I am prepared for my learning.

APPRENTICE: I ask open and closed questions to understand. I share my ideas with others. I can look for the right information on my own.

EXPERT: I research information using a variety of sources. I can explain my thinking.

GRADUATE: I am an active seeker, user and creator of knowledge and learning. I am an achiever of personal excellence.

Owning our Learning means that we value curiosity. We encourage children to be critical thinkers, and ask questions. Through our termly Inquiries we develop questioning and research skills. We follow a cycle of Knowing, Organising Information, Researching and Understanding. This term our Inquiry has a focus on Planet Earth and Beyond.

It is not only in Inquiry that we promote 'Owning our Learning'. In all areas of our KKPS curriculum we expect that children will become leaders of their learning, by knowing what they are learning and what comes next.

Our 3WCs (3 way conferences) provide an opportunity for goal setting two times throughout the year, but the process of establishing learning goals and reflecting on them is part of our daily life at KKPS.
