KKPS has 4 KORU values- 'Kia Kaha', 'Owning our Learning', 'Respect and Responsible' and 'Understanding and Accepting'. Over the coming newsletters we'll break down these values, what they mean and how our tamariki are on a journey to develop them. This week we shine a light on RESPECTFUL AND RESPONSIBLE.

Our KORU values were created to promote positive behaviours not only in the classroom and at Kerikeri Primary School, but also to develop essential skills that are necessary for everyday life. Being respectful towards others and taking responsibility for our choices, our belongings and our well being contribute to being great global citizens.

Being respectful and responsible are life skills that need to be nurtured. Whether we're at school, at home, at the shops, online or face to face, our tamariki need to be coached and supported in making healthy respectful choices.

Tāku Hikoi - Respectful and Responsible

BEGINNER: I play with others. I follow instructions. I listen to others' ideas and opinions of others. I work and play well with others. I care for my things, my friends and my school.

NOVICE: I listen to others' ideas and opinions of others.. I work and play with others. I care for my things, my friends and my school..

APPRENTICE: I value the opinions of others. I'm respectful when I'm winning or losing. I care for my environment.

EXPERT: I treat others how I'd like to be treated. I understand about choices and consequences. I care for my environment. I collaborate with others.

GRADUATE: I demonstrate respect, for myself, others and the environment.

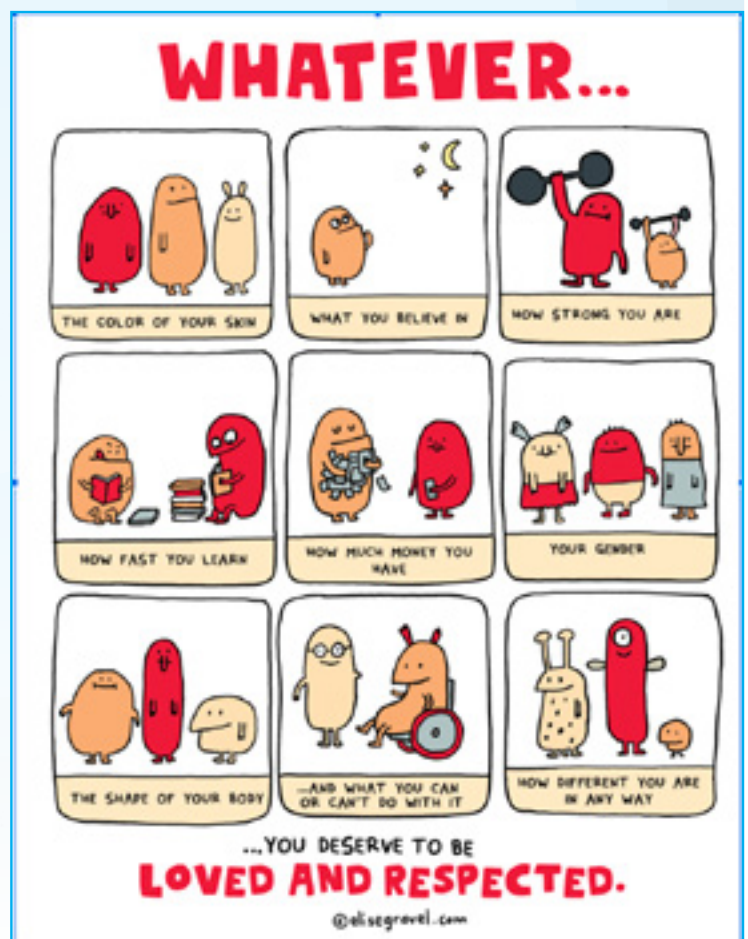

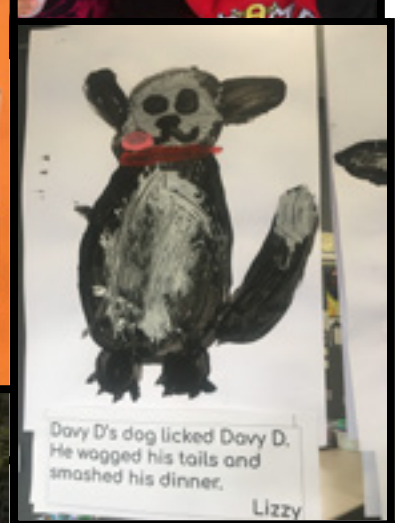
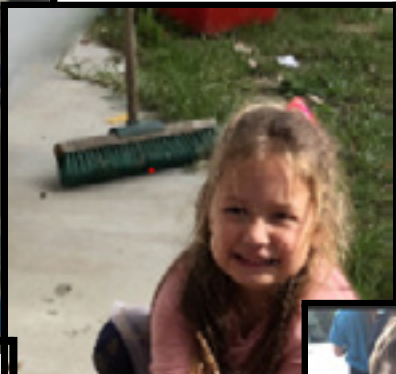
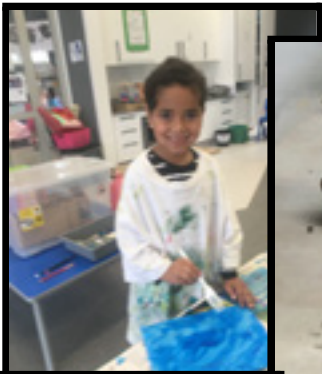


Class of the Fortnight
