While there will be some impact on the usual school programme that day, we have adjusted the programme to minimise disruption, and the school will remain open.




Science Fair and Roopu day

Week Seven - Understanding and Accepting Others

KKPS has 4 KORU values- 'Kia Kaha', 'Owning our Learning', 'Respect and Responsible' and 'Understanding and Accepting'. Over the coming newsletters we'll break down these values, what they mean and how our tamariki are on a journey to develop them. This week we shine a light on UNDERSTANDING AND ACCEPTING others

Like all the KORU values, learning to understand and accept others is a hugely important life skill. We are all unique and our differences are what make us special. We may not all agree on who's the strongest superhero, or what's the best flavour of ice cream, but that's okay. We need to support our tamariki to play/work alongside others, and to begin to encourage them to think about how others might feel in different situations.

Our Rōpū Days provide an opportunity for our tamariki to work together with children of all ages. They nurture tuakana/teina relationships and develop the understanding and acceptance of others. Next week our Rōpū Day has a Matariki (Māori new year) focus in preparation for our celebration in week 9. Matariki is an important celebration in the Māori calendar and by celebrating together we are nurturing understanding and acceptance of all. Tāku Hīkoi- Understanding and Accepting **EMERGENT:** I talk about my feelings with support. I am kind. I share with others with support.

BEGINNER: I talk about my feelings. I know that others have feelings. I share with others.

NOVICE: I awhi others. I know that sharing is caring. I understand what empathy is.

APPRENTICE: I invite others into my play. I share positive comments with others. I show patience towards others. I am beginning to accept the differences of others.

EXPERT: I show empathy. I respect and accept the differences of others.

GRADUATE: I am positive and confident in who I am. I work collaboratively with others.


