Owning our Learning	We are Lifelong Learners We are always open to new learning and challenges For Example: We take part in professional development- some individually and some as school staff. We're always learning; reading articles, completing courses, and having learning discussions with each other.
Respectful and Responsible	We listen to each other, and to all key stakeholders We take care of school property and resources For Example: We talk respectfully to each other and we take care of our school.
Understand and accept others	 We are committed to what is good for the school and colleagues, not just what might be good for ourselves We are kind For Example: We may not always agree with each other's opinions, but the way we respond to differences is key.


