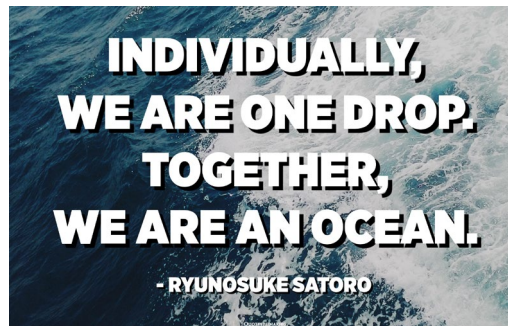

- I won't have more than four tabs open at the same time
- If I accidentally break or damage a device I will report it to the teacher straight away

- I won't use unkind words to describe anyone or their work
- If I see something inappropriate, I will close the device and tell my teacher
