



Week Nine How δο we celebrate our KORU kiδs at KKPS?

KKPS KORU school follows a framework called Positive Behaviours for Learning, which is a New Zealand Ministry of Education initiative, based on the PBIS framework founded in the USA. It advocates that by teaching, and rewarding behaviours that we want, we can help shape Positive Behaviour for Learning.



The process starts by us teaching our tamariki how would like them to behave. What does it look like? What does it sound like? What does it feel like? Once the children have been taught the behaviours we expect we reward them in a number of ways.

We are all committed to providing positive feedback to our Tamariki. You may have seen this poster in classrooms. This reminds us that we need to give 4 positive comments, for every negative given. You may hear our teachers say "I really like the way you are keeping your hands and feet to yourself", or "Thank you for keeping your sparkly eyes on me- you are being respectful". Our praise needs to be specific to the things we want to see and not just 'good job'.

Koru slips are given. These are a positive affirmation of a child showing us KORU



behaviours. Again, we aim to be really specific with the explanations. Your child may receive a KORU slip as an acknowledgement of their KORU behaviour e.g. for showing respect in assembly. These slips are very important and the children really like to receive them. The message they get verbally is as important as the slip itself. KORU slips are then put into boxes and each week Mrs Brown draws names out for Prizes from her prize box. Prizes are small toys, accessories or activities e.g 15 minutes of free time with a buddy.

Classes may also have their own reward systems using Class Dojo, certificates, stickers, flags, golden time e.t.c. These rewards promote KORU behaviours too.

At fortnightly team assemblies, certificates are also given highlighting different children's achievements in relation to the KORU values. These are well received. The tamariki enjoy being recognised for their learning and behaviours by their peers. This is a time of real celebration.

Taku Hikoi provides a record of achievements in relation to the KORU values. Taku Hikoi is reviewed at regular intervals and children are awarded a number of different digital badges.

At graduation, celebrating achievements KKPS in year 6, tamariki are recognised for a variety of achievements. There are awards within classes, and across the year 6 cohort. The Principal's Award, Award for Services to the School, awards for achievement in arts, maths and literacy, are also given to acknowledge achievements.

The awards, the accolades, the celebrations are wonderful, the certificates, the stickers and the slips are great but the goal is, for all our children to have success, because they have Positive Behaviours for Learning. They are KORU kids and they know how to learn today and forever.

Front cover features your child's Artwork or Photo. Wire Bound with 50 x A5 sized pages of blank art paper. Protected with plastic covers front and back.












MAKING BEES WAX WRAPS - A GREAT WAY TO REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF PLASTIC WE USE!

Beeswax food wraps

A beeswax wrap is an environmentally friendly alternative to using glad wrap. It can be used for wrapping lunches, leftovers and snacks. The wrap can be used again and again, reducing rubbish! Use the warmth of your hands to mould the wrap around your food.

Care instructions

- When your Honey-wrap needs a clean always use cold water and mild soap
 Either dry on a dish rack or use a tea-towel to pat dry off.
- 3. Your wrap doesn't like heat so don't use in the microwave or dishwasher
 4. Don't use on raw meat





If your honey wraps starts cracking then you can fix it by re-melting the wax. Simply place between two sheets of baking paper and iron it until the wax has re-melted on the cloth. Beeswax can be quite messy and sticky so make sure you do use baking paper.
