Thanks everyone for your support this past week with the Covid cases at school. The cases in rooms 6 and 7 continue to grow. Today we informed families of room 8 that there was a probable case in their class on Wednesday. As a precautionary measure, we encouraged them to collect their child. There continues to be staff and children in the school who are isolating due to being identified as a close contact to a case. If your child is identified as a close contact, we will contact you as soon as possible to inform you of this.

While at home isolating as a close or secondary contact, we can provide distance learning for your child/ren. Your child's teacher will be in contact about how this will work. You can also access our home learning tab on our school website: https://www.kerikeriprimary.school.nz/homelearning/

The Ministry of Education has explained that when a school is open and your child has not been advised to isolate, then it is expected that your child will continue to attend school. Following Ministry advice, we won't be providing distance learning for children who are choosing to stay at home.

Later this term we have Constable Rob visiting us for bike safety sessions, Life Education will be visiting with Harold the Giraffe! And we will be starting the Keeping Ourselves safe Programme.

about the KOS programme:

What will children and young people learn? They will learn:

- to work out when their safety is at risk
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people
- who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse
- that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules

They will know:

- that abuse is never okay
- that abuse is never their fault.



Te Manawa Tahi is a concept and approach that aims to strengthen the connection between whānau, community and education under the Learning Support Delivery Model kaupapa (New Learning Support Delivery Model: six elements (education.govt.nz)). Part of that approach is community hubs, held across the rohe, for whānau to access specialists from Ministry of Education and RTLB for the purposes of kōrero around any learning support concerns and next steps. It's also about removing some barriers to service access for the community and other professional bodies.

The services work to be adaptable, flexible and approachable. Whānau can access community hubs where appropriate even if it is just to connect for a cuppa and biscuit. The 0800 can be called or whānau can drop into the MOE offices to discuss.

ClassDojo

How does Class Dojo support our KORU values?

Class Dojo plays an important role in promoting our KORU values, and building positive relationships between teachers, students and whānau. We know that nurturing happy, healthy and confident children is a team effort, and effectively communicating with each other is essential in trying to achieve this goal.

Class Dojo allows KKPS KORU school to easily communicate and share with whānau. The app promotes collaboration on many levels which is why it is so effective. It can be on your smartphone, tablet or accessed through a PC/laptop.

School Story

Whole school events will be shared on 'School Story'. These may be upcoming events, or photos and videos from the events themselves. Reminders will be sent to your app to remind you that tomorrow is Pyjama today, or that it's a School Disco on Friday.

Class Story

Class events or learning activities will be shared here by classroom teachers. These posts are relevant to the class group. Whether it's a reminder about Library Day or a video from today's science experiment, Class Story will give you information on a class level.

Portfolio

Each child has their own learning portfolio on Class Dojo. Each year their portfolio gets rolled over to the new year so children can look back to their work

not only earlier in the year but earlier in their time at KKPS. Posts here are specific to your child. In the early years, these posts will be largely teacher-led, however, as children grow in digital competency they will learn to upload their own posts.

You can acknowledge posts at any level by clicking the love heart icon. You can also comment. We really appreciate positive comments and so do your children. Each time you celebrate your child's efforts with a "Great work!" you help to motivate them and build their confidence.

Messaging

You can message your child's teacher on Classdojo. This is particularly helpful when you're unable to make it into school, but you'd like to make contact with the teacher.

Big Ideas

The Classdojo BIG IDEAS are a series of videos that focus on different social and emotional learning aspects. You can access these on <u>YouTube</u>.
