Classes are all underway with their Choices inquiry and will soon be moving into Keeping ourselves safe which was shared in our last newsletter.

The wave of covid cases at this time has eased off and we are currently dealing with two cases at school. This will no doubt change in the coming weeks given the number of cases in our community/ New Zealand. With the current rules, there are no close contacts, however we are going to work on the following: if a child is positive while at school during their infectious period, and they were wearing a mask, then other children are not considered close contacts.

If the positive case was not wearing a mask or was a wearing a mask in an ineffective manner, then the child's class will become close contacts. The Ministry of Health has advised that close contacts can continue to attend school, and are no longer required to isolate unless they display covid symptoms. We have our next PTA meeting on March 14th at 6pm at school (in the staffroom) to discuss upcoming fundraisers. We would love to have some new parents join the PTA. Week Five - Inquiry Term 1 - Choices

This term, our topic is 'Choices'. Our students will participate and inquire through a thought provoking programme. We will research some different body systems, and think about ways we can make choices that will help to keep different body systems healthy. We will also delve into the choices that we have to make in other areas of our lives and what makes a good choice.

KKPS is also taking part in the Keeping Ourselves Safe Programme in Term 1. Throughout this programme children will learn

- to work out when their safety is at risk
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people
- who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse
- that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules.

They will know:

- that abuse is never okay
- · that abuse is never their fault.


