
Our next meeting is on Monday 11th April at 6pm in the staffroom - all new members welcome.





# Week Nine Koru Kiðs Recap part 2

KKPS has 4 KORU values- 'Kia Kaha', 'Owning our Learning', 'Respect and Responsible' and 'Understanding and Accepting'. This week we are expanding on Respect and Responsible and Understanding and Accepting.

Our KORU values were created to promote positive behaviours not only in the classroom and at Kerikeri Primary School, but also to develop essential skills that are necessary for everyday life. Being respectful towards others and taking responsibility for our choices, our belongings and our well being contribute to being great global citizens.

Being respectful and responsible are life skills that need to be nurtured. Whether we're at school, at home, at the shops,online or face to face, our tamariki need to be coached and supported in making healthy respectful choices. Class Dojo has a series of short video clips to support the message of Respect- Episode 1, Episode 2 and Episode 3, Amazing Things Happen

Like all the KORU values, learning to understand and accept others is a hugely important life skill. We are all unique and our differences are what make us special. We may not all agree on who's the strongest superhero, or what's the best flavour of ice cream, but that's okay. We need to support our tamariki to play/work alongside others, and to begin to encourage them to think about how others might feel in different situations.

Our Rōpū Days provide an opportunity for our tamariki to work together with children of all ages. They nurture tuakana/teina relationships and develop the understanding and

acceptance of others. Next week our Rōpū Day has a Matariki (Māori new year) focus in preparation for our celebration in week 9. Matariki is an important celebration in the Māori calendar and by celebrating together we are nurturing understanding and acceptance of all.
