Welcome back everyone and a warm welcome to all of our new families who have joined us this week. Our children have come back refreshed and have settled back into school life really well. As per my previous email, we continue to closely follow the guidance from the Ministries of Health and Education in regards to our Covid response. Currently at Orange light, masks are not mandatory, instead they are 'strongly recommended'. We are also able to resume having assemblies (Fridays at 10.15am - whole school - odd weeks) and whole school whakatauki (Mondays at 8.50am). Parents are welcome to join us for these. Today we held our first whole school assembly in what must be close to two years since our last! The children did incredibly well today and overall I must say that they have demonstrated such resilience with all that has been happening over the past couple of years.

As many of you will be aware, our Board applied for recapitation at the beginning of last year to have year 7 and 8s at our school in 2022. This process with the Ministry of Education (MoE) was expected to be completed in 2021. The MoE has been slow in assessing the application, with little progress being made to date and no clear timeline able to be provided for moving forward. Due to this, the difficult decision has been made not to proceed any further with the application and the board has decided to focus and build on what we are doing in years 0-6 and prepare our students as best as we can for the next step in their education. We will continue to work closely with the high school to ensure our students have a smooth transition into year 7.

In term 3, our year 5 and 6 students will be performing a production. They will be carrying out auditions later this term and rehearsals in term 3. We will share more details about dates and times

for the shows closer to the time.

The attendance at our recent three way conferences (3WC) was the best we have ever had. Thank you for coming along and celebrating what your child has been learning at school. We welcome any feedback on the 3WCs, please email or come in and see me to chat about them.

This term we have welcomed some new teachers: Miss Philippa (Pip) Heger (Room 25) and Miss Chloe Majthenyi (Room 13). Tina Schonweiss returned as a Teacher Aide. At the end of last term, our amazing caretaker Mr Mau Muunu left. We thank Mau for the outstanding job he did of keeping our grounds so pristine over the last ten years. We wish Mau every success with his future endeavours. Greg Tatnell will be joining us in the caretaker role next week.

This week we have been fortunate enough to have hosted the Life Education Trust at our school. They will be at school for two weeks, running programmes for each class to support our Health curriculum. Harold the Giraffe is a key part of this programme:
