Term Two - Week 5 Koru Kids Keep Calm

We can all experience times in our lives when we feel overwhelmed, stressed and anxious. (We call this our red brain). There are lots of things we can do to make ourselves feel better (back in our green brain). We may take a walk, meet a friend for a chat, practice yoga, or a number of other activities. This is no different to our beautiful tamariki, who are at times, also challenged. Sometimes, they may be frustrated by an activity, encounter conflict with others, have a sleepless night, or be subject to any number of factors that affect their emotions and wellbeing.

When these situations arise at KKPS we support our children to use strategies to help return them to a place of calm. This poster is a visual prompt and to help support our children to calm. These strategies are easy to implement and need little resources. They can be used in the classroom and the playground.

Next time your child is feeling overwhelmed outside of school why not try one of these strategies.

KORU expectation of the fortnight

We are focusing on our Before/After school expectations this fortnight. Over the next two weeks, have a chat with your child about how they get to/from school and the KORU/Safety expectations surrounding this



Before School	Wait outside Room 5 until you hear the 8am bell (no playing on the playground), put your belongings away and prepare for the day as per teacher instructions, go outside and play, at 8.50am bell go straight to your classroom, late students must sign in at the office before going to class	
After School	Wait patiently away from the playground, remember to take your belongings home, help those that are lost, go straight to your destination.	
Pick Up	Wait patiently, stay seated on benches, listen to instructions, walk sensibly to car with adult, be a role model for others	
Bus	Follow the bus rules, listen to bus monitors, look after your equipment, get your name ticked off on roll before getting on the bus.	
Walking Home	Walk through the school quietly, be mindful of traffic, use the pedestrian coffee, leave the school promptly and walk straight to your destination.
