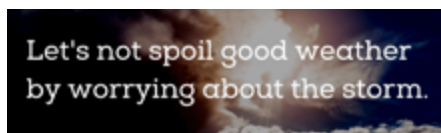

We have learned to programme the Beebots to go forwards and backwards, and turn left and Right.



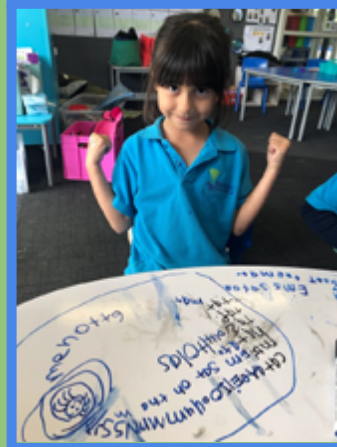
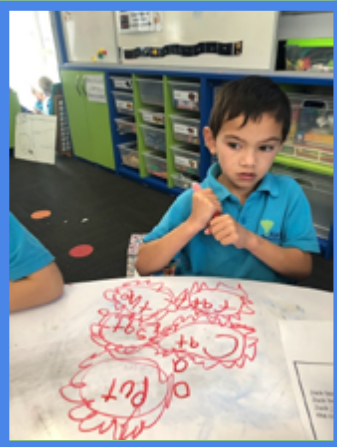
We love to build and create with Mobilo.
