



The Incredible Years® is a series of interlocking, evidence-based programs for parents, children, and teachers, supported by over 30 years of research. The goal is to prevent and treat young children's behaviour problems and promote their social, emotional, and academic competence.

The programs are used worldwide in schools and mental health centers, and have been shown to work across cultures and socioeconomic groups. At KKPS teachers have been trained to use the strategies within their classrooms to help promote positive behaviours.

Alongside the program for teachers lies a program for parents, and we are fortunate to have this course running locally thanks to Ngāti Rehia.

What is Incredible Years Parenting?

The Incredible Years kaupapa is a parenting program aimed at helping parents:

- To have a better relationship with their children
- Stimulate their children's development
- Gain skills to feel more confident about their parenting
- Have a positive and nurturing parenting style
- Lessen harsh parenting practices
- Establish better relationships with the child's teacher

The Incredible Years Parenting Program focuses on:

How to play with your child The value of effective praise Using rewards to motivate children How to set limits with your children How to handle mis-behaviour by ignoring, distracting and redirecting Logical and natural consequences Creative problem solving

Incredible Years Parenting Program methods are:

Based on the way children develop Trialled and tested and have been proven to work with most children and cultures including New Zealand

Encouraging a nurturing relationship in the process of learning about children's behaviours

Parents work together to find solution that suits them best Parents discover new skills they

can use
Parents in the group are

encouraged to support each other


