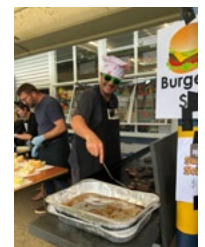

Term Four - Week 3

KKPS KORU school follows a framework called Positive Behaviours for Learning, which is a New Zealand Ministry of Education initiative, based on the PBIS framework founded in the USA. It advocates that by teaching, and rewarding behaviours that we want, we can help shape Positive Behaviour for Learning.

The process starts by us teaching our tamariki how we would like them to behave. What does it look like? What does it sound like? What does it feel like? Once the children have been taught the behaviours we expect we reward them in a number of ways.

KKPS teachers have created lesson plans outlining what we need to teach our children. We have targeted areas that children

may not be aware of, may have forgotten, or may just need a refresh!

Teachers have worked together in mixed teams - Juniors, Middles, and Seniors - so that we can cover all areas for our tamariki. We have also found resources, materials, and experiences where children can feel successful and show these values.

KORU Value of the Fortnight:

SWIMMING POOL

As we begin the final term, it is a great opportunity to review our expectations of KORU Kids in the classroom. At the beginning of the year, each class created their own 'Class Treaty'. We'll be reviewing this agreement and what it looks like, sounds like and feels like to be a KORU Kid within our classrooms. Term 4 swimming begins soon. This is a great time to review how KORU Kids use the school pool.

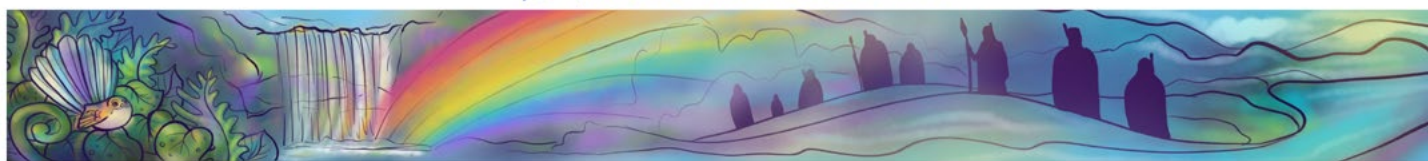

Mural 1 features a night scene of Puketī Forest, with a kiwi and ruru tucked in amongst the kawakawa leaves. The puriri moths flying around the moon was inspired by one of the student's drawings.

Mural 2 features the magnificent Rainbow falls, a favourite among the kids artworks. The silhouetted Rangatira meet in the mist, alongside the river while a playful piwakawaka watches on.

Mural 3 features many local and seasonal visitors to the Bay of Islands. The kids loved drawing the sea creatures, whales, orca and dolphins were very popular! The iconic Hole in the Rock and Cape Brett can be seen in the distance.

Mural 4 features the magnificent kaka birds that once frequented the area so much so that it was said they would make the sky appear to be as dark as night while in flight. The wafting smoke signal shows how the was an important place to communicate between tribes.
