Term Four - Week 5

2022 has proven to be a successful year in terms of how KKPS KORU School values and expectations have been promoted across the school. Much work has been done with staff, whānau and tamariki to develop sustainable practice.

2022 Highights:

Regular PLD with staff:

- Term 1: A day recapping the key components of the PB4L Framework and how it relates to KKPS KORU school
- Terms 2 and 3: Sessions with Melanie Martin developing staff understanding about coregulation and "Time to Calm"
- Term 4: Looking at the data from 2022 to consider 'what next' for KKPS KORU School
- \$5,000 project funding grant to develop "Time to Calm" practices throughout the school. Puppets to teach social and emotional skills were purchased from local puppeteer Kylie Penn. A 'Time to Calm' Kete was created for each class. Teachers had two sessions of PLD and the Support Staff also had PLD.
- \$5,000 project funding grant to develop KORU signage across the school.
- Mrs Brooks completed Tier 2 training through MOE facilitation.
- Tier 2 systems have been developed, documented and shared with the staff.
- A KKPS KORU Handbook has been created and housed in the KKPS shared Google Drive

Next Steps for 2023:

- Install signage across the school promoting KKPS Koru Values and Expectations using both te reo Māori and English
- Revisit KKPS acknowledgement systems including KORU slips. Consider student/staff and whānau voice. Design a system for our acknowledgements. Introduce and implement a new system.
- Develop Tier 3 systems at KKPS
- Strengthen our Tier 2 systems.
- Review and reflect on KKPS KORU School practice through regular collections of student/staff and whānau voice
- Update the KKPS website to show our KORU framework and practices.

As summer rapidly approaches, the school gardens have burst to life! Over the next two weeks we will focus on how we use our KORU values in the school gardens. Teachers will visit the gardens with their tamariki to model and discuss what the expectations are. Students will be given the opportunity to role-play what these look like, sound like and feel like.
