

We are also very excited to introduce the [Think and Be Me](#) kaupapa to our school. Think and Be Me promotes children's mental health and well being. Throughout the course of the year children will meet characters "Cool Cat" "Watchdog" and "Angry Dragon". Teachers will be using resources and support material from Cat Levine from Think and Be Me.

Our first few weeks back at school focus on building strong relationships - Whakawhanaungatanga. We want to get to know each other - staff, children and families. It's all about the people. We know that strong relationships are the foundation for great learning to occur, which is why it's so important that we work together ("Mahi Tahī") for the benefit of our tamariki (children).

Each class will be creating a collaborative treaty or agreement that they can refer back to over the year. They will be unpacking what it means to be kind and what respectful looks like in their classroom.

Our new swings also give us a new environment to teach in. We are learning to take turns, be patient
