It has been a great start to the year and KKPS KORU School, and our KORU systems are up and running. Classes have created class treaties and have began to unpack our school expectations.



During 2022 we were lucky enough to secure funding from PB4L-SW for our work with "Time to Calm". The funding enabled our teachers to receive some PLD around the use of calming strategies in the classroom and how to teach them.

We also used the money to fund these amazing puppets, created by local puppeteer creator Kylie Penn. These puppets will be used in classes to teach social and emotional skills. They are just so gorgeous. We can't wait to use them in our classrooms.



Another grant was received to develop our KORU signage throughout the school. There is a focus on bi-lingual signage. The new signs will help to reinforce our KORU expectations throughout the school.

Our expectations focus for this fortnight are:

Eating Expectations

Keep Strong (Kia Kaha)

- Walk to an approved eating area
- Stay 'in your bubble' (personal space)

Owning Our Learning (Tō mātou akoranga)

- Choose appropriate food for the eating time (healthy snack)
- Stay seated while eating and until the bell goes
- Eat in an orderly manner
- Put away your named lunch box and drink bottle

Respectful & Responsible (Whakaute me te haepapa)

- Put food scraps in piggy bucket
- Put your rubbish back in your lunchbox

Understanding & Accepting (Māramatanga me te tautoko)

- Don't share food
- Wash hands or use sanitiser
- That we don't comment on others food and that people bring different foods

- Active learners

 - Line up outside
- Come in quietly
- Place book bag on the trolley and your returns on the desk

Understanding & Accepting (Māramatanga me te tautoko)

- Have pride in your environment
- Actively participate
- Actively listen
- Think about how your actions may affect others
 - Take turns when playing with games
- Leave the Library tidy
