We have been learning to extend our pepeha and include our whakapapa. This artwork reminds us of who we are and where we have come from.



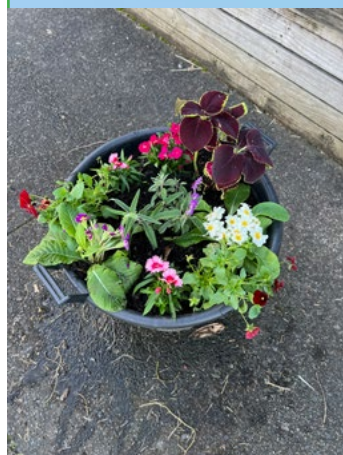

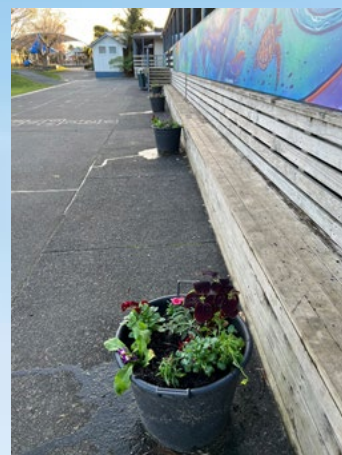

WHY US?

Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Rēhia Trust
has been presenting the
Incredible Years Programmes
since May 2021, and we run 2
courses a year.

We now have 4 trained
coordinators to facilitate the
programme at Te Pou o Manako
(NorthTec Campus) in Kerikeri

What is Incredible Years?

It's a parenting programme aimed at
helping parents:

- to have a better relationship
with their children
- stimulate their children's
development
- gain skills to feel more confident
about their parenting
- have positive and nurturing
parenting styles
- lessen harsh parenting practices
- establish better relations with
the child's teacher



DOES IT WORK?

Parents say that their children's
behaviour has been less aggressive,
they showed more normal behaviour
and had a happier family life.

Parent training remains the single
most effective way to help young
children with challenging behaviour
problems.

HOW LONG IS IT?

Each programme consists of 14
sessions that last 2-3 hours.

Our methods:

The Incredible Years Parenting
methods are focused on:

- how to play with your child
- the value of effective praise
- using rewards to motivate
children
- how to set limits with your
children
- how to handle misbehaviour:
 - ignoring, distractions,
redirects, warnings
 - time out for aggressive
behaviour
 - logical and natural
consequences
 - creative problem solving



Parenting Pyramid®
