Parent Information Evening - Structured Literacy:



At KKPS our Digital Safety expectations follow our KORU values. We explicitly teach our children to use the internet responsibly and help them to understand the importance of being safe online.

In school Linewise acts as a line of defence for our tamariki. It is great to hear how many of you have also taken the opportunity to use this at home.

It is important to remember that whilst Linewise gives us some reassurance that children can not access unsafe sites, the best strategy is for us to support our tamariki to become confident users of the internet. We can do this by empowering them to know how to keep themselves safe.


