At the end of last term we were fortunate enough to receive another grant from the MOE PB4L-SW team. This follows our previous successful applications for Time to Calm and the Signage Project. This grant was awarded to help us develop a Sensory Garden at school. Our Sensory room is well used as a space where children can go when they need a quiet place to calm. The Sensory garden will sit alongside this space as another place children can go to 'Take 5'

Teachers were able to share what we do in our Structured Literacy lessons and show some of the resources we use.

- We now know how the brain learns to read and we have the science to prove it
- Some brains learn quicker than others
- Structured Literacy is a program that will teach all of our children
- Structured Literacy follows a scope and sequence that all teachers will follow

A friendly reminder that it is the caregiver's responsibility to supervise their children prior to the children boarding the school bus in the morning and once they get off the school bus in the afternoon.




Class of the fortnight Room 12 with Hannah Taylor
