

Class of the fortnight Room 23 – with Rupert Moore

Room 23 has been experimenting with silhouette art and a variety of mediums. After examining the natural structure of trees we drew them in pencil. We then traced our outline in pen before going over our trees in pastels using complimentary colours. After smudging and wiping off the excess pastel we then coloured the tree in black pastel and went over the fine lines in black pencil.
