
NEWSLETTER

MAKE TIME TO READ ALOUD



We LOVE Class Dojo.

For many years KKPS has used the Class Dojo platform to share information with our parent community. We use it to keep you up to date with things that are happening at the school. The School stories, Class Stories and individual portfolios have been used to share snapshots of learning experiences, and events.

Next year, we're taking Class Dojo to the next level. From January 2024 we will be using Class Dojo as our schoolwide acknowledgement system. These digital points will replace our KORU slips. There are so many advantages to making this change. As a connected parent you will be able to see each time your child is rewarded with a point, and celebrate their successes at home too. As an enviro school, the removal of paper for tickets and plastic prizes means that we are helping our environment too.

Class Dojo is now closed for the year as we are undertaking some KKPS Class Dojo maintenance over the summer.

If you need to contact your child's 2023 class teacher you will need to use their email, pop in or call the office.

In early 2024 Class Dojo will be available again. You will be able to message your child's 2024 teacher and you will start receiving alerts about events that are planned for Term 1. Remember there is no limit to how many parents/caregivers are attached to a child, so you can add grandparents, aunts and uncles etc.
