Revised Timetable Trial:

As mentioned in a previous email, we are currently trialling a revised timetable inspired by the Finnish education model, a leading education system globally. This term, our day is structured into approximately 50-minute learning blocks followed by a 15-minute play break. This adjustment is based on several considerations, including the attention span of primary school-aged children and the promotion of positive mental health through regular play.

We encourage you to share your observations and experiences with this new timetable throughout the term. At the end of the term, we will gather feedback from both students and staff to make an informed decision on whether to continue with this approach.

Exciting Plans for Term One:

Looking ahead, we have an exciting term planned with various activities, including overnight camps for years 3-6, marae noho for Te Whakatupuranga classes, and a special visit from the Education Minister on Monday. This visit provides us with a fantastic opportunity to showcase the incredible learning environment we have at KKPS.

As we embark on this journey together, we want to express our gratitude for your ongoing support. We are confident that this term will be filled with growth, learning, and memorable experiences.


Morning Tea with the Principal
