School Bus Routes and Stops

Recently, we have been asked about the location of the school bus stops. These are set by the Kerikeri Transport Network who manage our school buses. Bus stops have to be safe places for students to get on and off the bus as well as safe places for the bus to pull into and then pull back out onto the road. The visibility of the driver to see the road and any hazards is of utmost importance. This may mean that the bus stop is not as close to your house or may even be on a different street.

The MOE sets guidelines for safety of students on school bus routes. Schools ensure that students get on the bus after school and reinforce the rules for all students to be seated, facing forward and wearing a seatbelt if one is available. Students are told not to distract the driver and to remain seated for the ride.

Parents must ensure children get to and from the bus stop safely and care for them at the bus stop. This means that all students should be taken to the bus stop by a parent or caregiver and this person should see them get on the bus. After school, a parent or caregiver should be at the bus stop to meet their child. It is the parent's responsibility to get children safely to and from the bus stop and care for them at the bus stop.

We are working with all the schools in our local area to ensure safe transport for your children. Please support us by reminding children about safe behaviour on and around the school bus.










All morning, we spoke negatively and mean to one of the apples. We then spoke very nicely, using kind words to the other apple.


We let them sit for the day...






What did we learn?
