A reminder to not park in the staff carpark or lane (health and safety) to the carpark after school. Some of the staff leave straight after school and are unable to, as cars are blocking them in.


We encourage you to pick up your children closer to 3pm, as this would lessen the traffic at 2.50pm. Thank you for your support with this.



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
