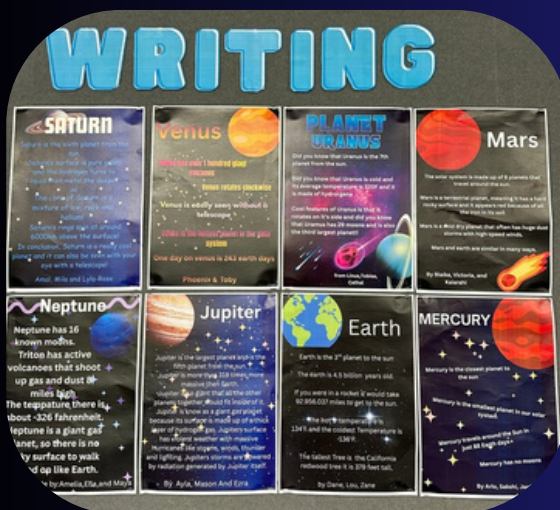
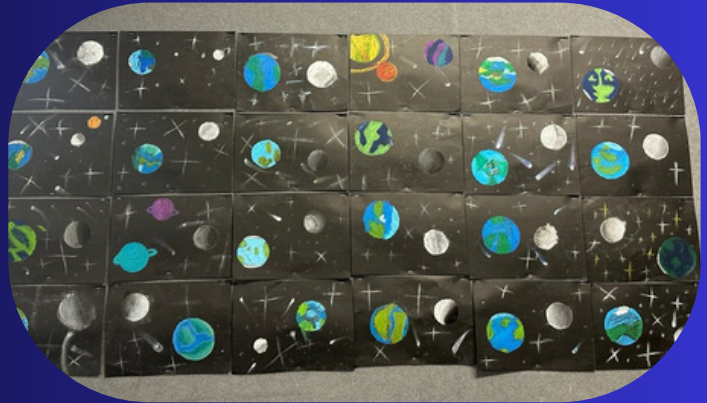


Room 23's Newsletter



Here is a snapshot of what we have accomplished in our recent Space Inquiry Unit:

- Research & Writing: Using the T.I.D.E. strategy (Topic, Important Evidence, Details, Ending), students analysed texts to write informative reports and create factual space posters.
- Planetary Comparisons: Students mapped out the similarities and differences between terrestrial, gas, and ice planets using Venn diagrams.
- Creative Space Art: Through hands-on artwork with Ms Hooper, the class explored the relative positions of the planets and the Moon to visualise the structure of our solar system.
